PARTICIPANT'S REGISTRATION

It is imperative to register at the Registration Desk prior to taking in any activities at the Festival. Everyone will need to pick up their Festival Passes and/or tickets before the adjudicated performance or attending any workshops or concerts. If you need to purchase any additional passes you may do so at the Desk. The Registration Desk is located in the lower level of the Calgary Convention Centre. The office will be open on Tuesday, May 16 from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm, Wednesday, May 17 to Saturday, May 20 from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm and on Sunday, May 21 from 7:00 am to 3:00 pm. Please allow yourself plenty of time to register prior to your performance time. There will be a \$50.00 replacement fee assessed for any lost participant passes with no exceptions. Each registered participant will receive a Participant Pass, Official Program, and Festival Newspaper. Passes must be worn at all times while on the Festival Sites.

NON PARTICIPANT/ AUDITOR REGISTRATION

A limited number of non participant passes are available at the Registration Desk to non performers. Non participants may register for all activities for 5 days for \$35.00 or may purchase single day passes for \$15.00 per day.

ADJUDICATION PACKAGES

Standards of Performance plaques, the Gold, Silver and Bronze awards for each participating ensemble will be available for pick up, along with adjudication sheets and tapes, at the Registration Desk between 7:00 pm & 8:00 pm the day of the performance and during posted office hours the day following the performance. For those ensembles performing on Sunday, May 21,

adjudication packages will be available for pick up between 6:30 pm and 7:30 pm Sunday evening. Honour Award Recipients will receive their Plaques and T-Shirts immediately following the adjudicated performance of their ensemble. These awards will be presented by an adjudicator. All scholarship winners will be announced at the Closing Ceremonies. Please note that any adjudication packages not picked up will be sent to the school after the Festival by regular mail or courier as soon as possible.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF STANDARDS OF PERFORMANCE

The Standards of Performance will be inside the Director's Package and will not be announced or posted at the Festival. However, the national media and general public will receive the results any time after 8:00 pm the day of the performance.

REGISTRATION FORMS AND FEES

Registration forms are an integral part of the MusicFest experience. These forms enable the staff to ensure that the performance stage is ready, the sound technicians will get the sound just right, make sure that the ensemble is scheduled in the correct class and category for publication in the Official Program, the room supervisors can introduce the group correctly and the adjudicators will properly identify the ensemble and the selections to be performed. Deadline for these forms was April 14, 1995. All incomplete

forms must be completed at the Registration Desk which will result in possible delays in registration. Ensembles received a statement of account with the Confirmation of Performance. All registration payments were due by April 14, 1995. Registration fees must be paid in full and all forms completed before passes and concert tickets will be issued to any ensemble.

Out of the Garage

t's your first day on the job as a high school band director. A quick survey of the students in the band room reveals that you are short on brass and reed players, but have a half dozen guitar players hoping to play in the band. What do you do? You could pick the best two guitarists, have them alternate on the tunes that include a guitar chart, and send the other four home. Or, with a little creativity, you could let them all join in and grow musically - without compromising the integrity of your arrangements or having six guitarists playing chord changes.

Generally, guitarists in stage bands have few opportunities to perform outside of their customary role in the rhythm section. Many band directors call on the guitarist only to play rhythm, and on occasional blues or rock-oriented solo. If your instrumentation is sparse, a guitar could fill in missing horn parts.

The guitar's range is wide, and its sound blends especially well with either tenor saxophone or trombone. Guitar is also an excellent choice for reinforcing a weak horn section. This approach allows you to represent all of the lines in the arrangement, and ultimately gives guitarists a much broader musical experience than they will have in a garage band.

The first challenge will be to get the student guitarist reading standard notation. A majority of them play by ear and/or read guitar tablature only. All guitarists should learn to read the written language used by all of the other instruments.

A beginning guitarist usually has about the same range and facility as a beginning or intermediate tenor trombonist. As reading skill increases, an advancing player can read up to the high C above the treble staff (concert). Since guitar sounds an octave lower than written, parts are always notated in the treble clef, one octave above the actual pitch.

Through the use of the guitar synthesizer, sounds of unusual instruments can be simulated. There is no argument that the actual instruments are superior, but if they are unavailable, using a guitar synthesizer is an option for rounding out a needy stage band or orchestra.

A music department can purchase a guitar synthesizer for the price of a good brass or woodwind instrument. Five years ago, a colleague of mine bought a brass clarinet for his concert band and it hasn't been out of the case since. Given diminishing music budgets, a guitar synthesizer could be an economical educational

tool that meets numerous musical needs.

If your school is inundated with guitarists, a way to get them participating in your music program is to establish guitar ensembles. At Berklee, the standard guitar ensemble consists of six guitars, bass, and drums. My students have successfully written their own arrangements for school ensembles. Once they hear their arrangement, their quest for knowledge increases. Arranging provides an opportunity for young guitarists to gain much-needed knowledge about harmony and theory.

The guitar can be an asset in many musical situations. Giving guitarists more chances to participate will increase the appeal of your music program. With some creative management, the guitar can turn from a thorn in the band director's side to a drawing card. The possibilities of utilizing guitars in secondary school music programs are limited only by the band director's imagination.


