

The 25th Anniversary, a quarter century, is a milestone and a great moment for all of us who share an involvement with this wonderful movement. It gives pause for reflection, appreciation and recognition.

As I reviewed over 20 years of programs and newsletters, I marvelled at the voluntary, year after year commitment made by so many. Taking into account the diversity of Canada, the MusicFest Regional network is indeed a marvel. This network is a Canadian peculiarity and has, over the years, forged the grassroots foundation of this great event. Some of these regional festivals can trace their history of involvement back over 20 years. Halifax, New West, B.C. Interior, the Optimists in Manitoba and Saskatchewan, Northern Ontario and Niagara all share in longevity. And just as momentous as we look ahead, is the fact that we have welcomed eight new affiliates since September! This 25th Anniversary MusicFest is in fact the result of everyone's volunteer commitment!

They have been joined by a new generation of leaders who are distinguishing themselves even today: Frank Gnandt, Charles White, James Forde, Brian Lillos, Paul Read, Ardith Haley, David Proznick and Neil Yorke-Slader are just a few. These individuals and others like them can take pride, for this Festival is the product of their vision.

As I leafed through the pages in the programs, going back in time, there was a constant when it came to sponsorship, and that name is Yamaha. Please accept my best wishes for a most enjoyable and memorable festival.


