Frank has served as the Provincial Coordinator (Choral) for the Province of Alberta since 1991 and has been Vice-Chairman of Choral nationally for the past 3 years. He has adjudicated festivals throughout Western Canada and his ensembles have toured throughout North America and Europe.

Charles White, Head of Music at Port Perry High School in Oshawa, Ontario has been appointed as Vice Chairman for the Choral Division. Charles has been involved with MusicFest for over ten years and has served as a regional coordinator in the Southern Ontario area. Presently, Charles also holds the position of Executive Director of the Ontario Vocal Festival.

Frank and Charles together will help expand MusicFest's horizons by bringing together their choral and vocal jazz expertise as well as their input from both Eastern and Western Canada.

Andre Jutras served as Staff Conductor of the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra from 1991-1993. He has also conducted the Winnipeg, Edmonton and Quebec Symphony Orchestras as well as performances for the Alberta Ballet Company. In 1992 and 1993 he received the "Jean-Marie Baudet" award from the Canada Council. His concert band compositions are published by Barnhouse and distributed worldwide and two have been included on the 1995 MusicFest Syllabus.

In addition to directing the National Youth Band of Canada, Mr. Jutras will be adjudicating bands and orchestras and will be presenting a series of clinics.

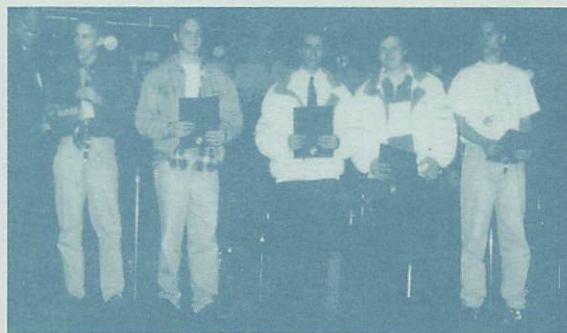
