Famed Yamaha flautist, recording artist, educator, composer and arranger Jimmy Walker from Los Angeles has been selected to conduct the 1996 Yamaha All Star Band.

Jim Walker has performed with the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra (Associate Principal Flute), the Los Angeles Philharmonic (Principal Flute) and has toured with the New York Philharmonic. He presently serves as Coordinator of flute at the University of Southern California and is a master teacher for the new World Symphony. In Addition to eight recordings and four tonight show appearances, he has appeared on NBC's Today Show and collaborated with Wayne Shorter, James Galway, Jean-Pierre Rampal, Leonard Bernstein, Mike Garson and Dudley Moore on various concert and recording projects. Jim can be heard on a variety of soundtracks including "The River", "Hook", "Far & Away", "Aliens III", "Back To The Future (1,2,3)", "Harry & The Hendersons", "The River Wild" and "Nell".

Band directors and adjudicators at the 1996 Festival will nominate outstanding young performers to the band. The successful nominees will rehearse on Sunday afternoon, May 26 and will perform at the Annual Awards Ceremony at 7:30 PM.

After November 1, the automatic 2 year Invitation will become void and ensembles will have to qualify at their regional festival or through taped application. The band is comprised of Canada's top studio musicians and will feature soloists including Phil Nimmons, Denny Christianson, Don Clark, Pat Labarbera and Steve McDade. In addition, Steve Houghton will be adjudicating the combo class and will be presenting a series of clinics and workshops for drummers and percussionists.

Steve Houghton is one of North America's most highly respected drummers and an acclaimed educator. He has performed with Bob Florence, Bill Holman, Frank Mantooth, Toshiko Akiyoshi, Doc Severinsen, Dave Samuels, Gary Burton, Billy Childs, Jeff Berlin, Scott Henderson, Mark Johnson, Woody Herman and Freddy Hubbard just to name a few. He is the National Percussion Chairman of the International Association of Jazz Educators, sits on the Board of Directors of the Percussion Arts Society and is a visiting faculty member at the Percussion Institute of Technology in Hollywood, California. Steve has authored four definitive texts for drummers: A Guide for the Modern Jazz Rhythm Section; Studio and Big Band Drumming; and Essential Styles for the Drummer and Bassist and most recently The Drummer's Performance Pak.

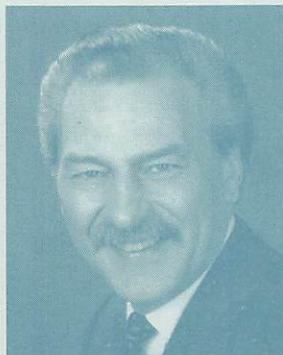

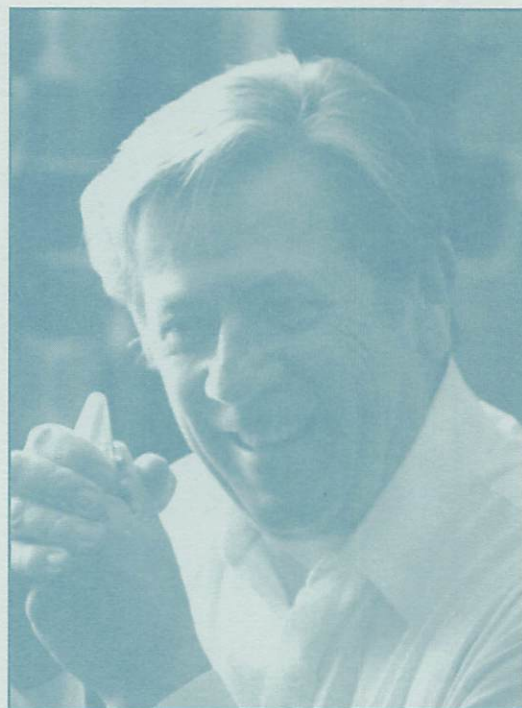

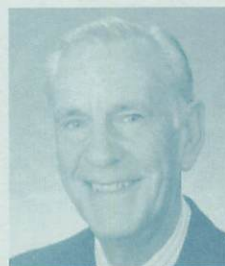
NATIONAL YOUTH BAND OF CANADA

Professor James Hargreaves has been selected to direct the band and trumpeter Jens Lindemann (sponsored by Yamaha Canada Music Limited) will be the guest soloist.

James Hargreaves is Professor of Music at St. Francis Xavier University in Antigonish, Nova Scotia where he teaches conducting, arranging, ear training and music education methodology. He is an Associate of the Royal College of Music and Associate of the Trinity College of Music. Professor Hargreaves has performed with the Scots Guards, the Maritime Jazz Orchestra and was the founding director of the Ottawa Civic Orchestra.
