He is the National Percussion Chairman of the International Association of Jazz Educators, sits on the Board of Directors of the Percussion Arts Society and is a visiting faculty member at the Percussion Institute of Technology in Hollywood, California. Steve has authored four definitive texts for drummers: A Guide for the Modern Jazz Rhythm Section; Studio and Big Band Drumming; and Essential Styles for the Drummer and Bassist and most recently The Drummer's Performance Pak.
