Making Music Your Business

Last fall, the Music Business/Management major made its maiden voyage at Berklee College of Music. Having spent the year designing the curriculum for this program and taking part in the many stages of its implementation, I can tell you that I am excited and gratified to see the high level of interest which it has generated. As the program grows and matures, this excitement will evolve into the stimulating challenge of providing business/management instruction in Berklee's cutting-edge tradition.

The basic mission of this program is to give students a competitive advantage in the music industry job market, where they can access careers in such areas as the operations of record companies and music publishing, talent representation, the marketing of music products, and in individual pursuits as producers and performers. In structuring this major, I attempted to find the right balance between courses focusing on the contemporary music industry, and those which are considered the common denominators of traditional business study, e.g. accounting, statistics, economics, marketing, and ethics. Tracks of study give students the opportunity to tailor their education to

emphasize corporate management, music merchandising, or entrepreneurship, while allowing the flexibility to elect courses in venue management, concert promotion, cross-cultural communication, public speaking, music intermediaries, etc.

With courses such as International Industry Operations, International Merchandising and Sales, Computer Applications in the Music Industry, and International Marketing, one can readily see that this program will have a distinct international and technological emphasis. Courses and lab experiences will focus on the computer hardware and software applications used in, or anticipated by, the music industry, as well as the mechanisms for electronic

information retrieval in the international marketplace.

As capstones to their education, students will have the opportunity to enter the music industry through approved and monitored internships. Others may receive managerial experience through the Berklee Music Company, an idea of mine which would unify college participants into a centralized mini-industry involving record production, music publishing, and talent representation.

The music industry exemplifies the shrinking nature of our world. We have entered a new era of international unification, calling for leaders with strong multicultural sensitivity. It is my hope that the music industry executives of tomorrow will have, in addition to business acumen and ethical integrity, a solid grasp of music in all its styles and configurations, and a skilled appreciation of the technology which will contribute to its creation. As a microcosm of this new world music industry, Berklee is in a unique position to provide these leaders.

Donald Gorder is the chair of the Music Business/Management Department at Berklee College of Music. He is also an educator and musician who has been in private practice as an entertainment lawyer, representing clients on matters of contracts and copyright.

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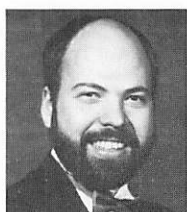


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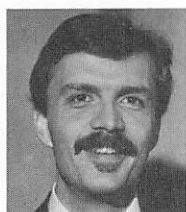


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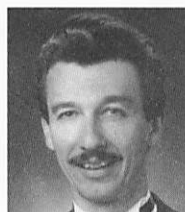

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CONFIRMATIONS OF PERFORMANCE

All Confirmations of Performance times are mailed out by May 1. This confirms where and when you will be performing. You must report to the warm up check-in desk 50 minutes prior to your performance to allow your ensemble to warm-up 45 minutes prior to the performance. The check-in desk is located close to the Main Entrances of the Edmonton Convention Centre in front of Hall C, and inside the front door of First Presbyterian Church for choral ensembles performing at the church.

It is imperative to register at the Registration Desk prior to taking in any activities at the Festival. You will need to pick up your Festival Passes before your adjudicated performance or attending any workshops or concerts. If you need to purchase any additional passes you may do so at the Desk. The Registration Desk is located close to the Main Entrances of the Edmonton Convention Centre in front of Hall A. The office will be open on Tuesday, May 11 from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm, Wednesday to Saturday 7:00 am to 8:00 pm, and Sunday from 7:00 am to 3:00 pm. Please allow yourself plenty of time to register prior to your performance time. There will be a \$45.00 replacement fee assessed for any lost participant passes with no exceptions. Each registered participant will receive a Participant Pass, Official Program, Poster and Festival Newspaper. Passes must be worn at all times while on the Festival Sites.

REGISTRATION PROCESS FOR NON-PARTICIPANTS

A limited number of non-participant passes are available at the Registration Desk to non-performers. Non-participants may register for all activities for 5 days for \$45.00 or may purchase single day passes for \$15.00 per day.

ADJUDICATION PACKAGES

Standards of Performance plaques, the Gold, Silver and Bronze awards for each participating ensemble, will be available for pick up, along with adjudication sheets and tapes, at the Registration Desk between 7:00 pm & 8:00 pm the day of the performance and during posted office hours the day following the performance. For those groups performing on Sunday, May 19, adjudication packages will be available for pick up

between 6:30 pm and 7:30 pm Sunday evening. Honour Award Recipients will receive their Awards immediately following the adjudicated performance of their ensemble. These awards will be presented by an adjudicator. All scholarship winners will be announced at the Closing Ceremonies. Please note that any adjudication packages not picked up will be sent to the school after the Festival by courier or mail as soon as possible.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF STANDARDS OF PERFORMANCE

The Standards of Performance will be inside the Director's Package and will not be announced or posted at the Festival. However, the national media and general public will receive the results any time after 8:00 pm the day of the performance.

REGISTRATION FORMS AND FEES

Registration forms are an integral part of the MusicFest experience. These forms enable the staff to ensure that the performance stage is ready, the sound technicians will get the sound just right, make sure that the ensemble is scheduled in the correct class and category for publication in the Official Program, the room supervisors can introduce the group correctly and the adjudicators will properly identify the ensemble and the selections to be performed. These forms were due by April 5, 1993. All incomplete forms must be completed at the Registration Desk which will result in possible delays in registration. Ensembles received a statement of account with the Confirmation of Performance. All registration payments were due by April 19, 1993. Registration fees must be paid in full and all forms completed before passes will be issued to any ensemble.

INSTRUMENT REPAIR SHOP

The repair shop, sponsored by Yamaha Canada Music Limited will be coordinated from the Yamaha Room, Salon 7 on the Meeting Level of the Edmonton Convention Centre. All minor repairs will be free of charge to MusicFest Canada participants.
