



TEACHING JAZZ IN BACH'S HOMETOWN

Dizzy Gillespie once said, "Jazz was born in the United States but Europeans discovered it first." While teaching and performing in Germany last year on a grant from the Arts America Program of the United States Information Agency, I learned what Dizzy was talking about. Though the state controlled conservatories in Germany emphasize classical music and give little credibility to jazz or rock, German students thirst for knowledge about about these forms of American music.

Serving as an artist-in-residence at conservatories in Cologne, Singen, Leipzig, and the Jazz and Rock School in Freiburg, I presented improvisation clinics, gave guitar lessons, conducted ensembles, and taught classes. I started out at the conservatory in Cologne, whose jazz program, headed by Professor Jiggs Whigham, is reputed to be one of the finest in Germany. The majority of rooms for classes, ensembles, and lessons, were allocated by the classical department, and equipment was in short supply. Nevertheless, there is much competition for the few openings in the jazz department. I found the students there to be quite advanced, enabling me to lecture on complex subjects.

My first session was a master class for guitarists. A student named Peter and I played a duet. He was very knowledgeable about scale vocabulary and single line playing, but I noted that he didn't develop motives, his phrases didn't breathe, and his timing was tense. I demonstrated how to breathe, relax, and listen to one's own melodic fragments to develop motives. After we played the tune again, the other students commented that Peter sounded like a different player, confirming the idea that a concept can elevate a player to another level faster than developing more chops. Other days were filled with private lessons, ensembles, and lectures for all instrumentalists on improvisation and harmonic analysis.

One requirement of my grant stipulated that I go to an east German conservatory and assist with their efforts to

make their musical standards commensurate with those of western schools. This was difficult to accomplish since there have been few previous exchanges, but I received an invitation from the Felix Mendelssohn Bartholdy Conservatory in Leipzig. I left from Cologne for Leipzig, the town where J.S. Bach lived the last part of his life, and had many memorable experiences there.

Leipzig's conservatory is one of the most beautiful in Europe. Though the city is run down from neglect during communist years, the conservatory did not suffer greatly. Formerly, all jazz records and sheet music had to be smuggled into the country, and *Real Books* were a rarity. The sheet music and books which I brought were of great interest to many at the conservatory, so before leaving, I donated much of the material to the school.

I found some of the students there to have very interesting playing styles. When the borders were closed, they had to construct their own concept of musical style without hearing a lot of recordings. The result was that they fused diverse elements together to create an eclectic, almost avant-garde style of playing.


The east Germans have not yet developed the same social competitiveness that often characterizes musicians' relationships in the west. This allows for a more relaxed interaction. While in Leipzig, Bach's music inspired me to write a new lecture titled "Single Line Melodic Counterpoint and the Music of Bach, Charlie Parker, and John Coltrane." From Bach's Sonatas and Partitas for Violin, I analyzed a section where he used a harmonic progression similar to that of the first eight bars of "All the Things You Are." To the students this discovery was a revelation. It seemed ironic that an American musician visiting Leipzig, the home of Bach, would show them a relationship between their countryman's music and jazz improvisa-

At the end of two weeks, students expressed that they had benefited from my theoretical explanations and demonstrations in performance. Some went as far as to say that I had changed their lives (musically speaking). After being featured in several student-faculty concerts, the east German musicians described my playing as being more melodic and energetic than they were used to, and dubbed it that "crazy American" style. This musical confluence of two cultures made for an interesting performance for both players and audience alike.

I discovered humorous differences between east and west. I often stress to my students the importance of playing out. I frequently tell them that no one is going to come knocking on their door and give them a gig. But, since few people have telephones in East Germany, many musicians *do* get gigs from people knocking on their door and asking them to play!

Working abroad is always culturally enriching, but the response of the German students and the audiences gave me the distinct impression that Diz had it right.

Following that, he was posted to the NORAD band in Colorado. Other postings included the Royal Canadian Artillery Band and the Canadian Forces School of Music in Victoria. After an appointment to the Canadian Forces School of Music in Borden, in 1992 he was selected as the Assistant Director of Music for the Central Band.







CONFIRMATIONS OF PERFORMANCE

All Confirmations of Performance times are mailed out by May 1. This confirms where and when all ensembles will be performing. Directors and ensembles must report to the appropriate warm up check-in desk (see maps in middle section of the Newspaper) 60 minutes (one hour) prior to the scheduled performance time to allow the ensemble to warm-up 45 minutes prior to the performance. PARTICIPANT'S REGISTRATION

It is imperative to register at the Registration Desk prior to taking in any activities at the Festival. Everyone will need to pick up their Festival Passes and/or tickets before the adjudicated performance or attending any workshops or concerts. If you need to purchase any additional passes you may do so at the Desk. The Registration Desk is located in the Constellation Hotel Reception Foyer. The office will be open on Tuesday, May 10 from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm, Wednesday May 11 to Saturday May 14 from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm and on Sunday May 15 from 7:00 am to 3:00 pm. Please allow yourself plenty of time to register prior to your performance time. There will be a \$50.00 replacement fee assessed for any lost participant passes with no exceptions. Each registered participant will receive a Participant Pass, Official Program, Poster and Festival Newspaper. Passes must be worn at all times while on the Festival Sites.

NON PARTICIPANT'S/ AUDITOR REGISTRATION

A limited number of non participant passes are available at the Registration Desk to non performers. Non participants (Auditors) may register for all activities for 5 days for \$30.00 or may purchase single day passes for \$15.00 per day.

ADJUDICATION PACKAGES

Standards of Performance plaques, the Gold, Silver and Bronze awards for each participating ensemble will be available for pick up, along with adjudication sheets and tapes, at the Registration Desk between 7:00 pm & 8:00 pm the day of the performance and during posted office hours the day following the performance. For those ensembles performing on Sunday May 15, adjudication packages will be available for pick up between 6:30 pm and 7:30 pm Sunday evening. Honour Award Recipients will receive their

Awards immediately following the adjudicated performance of their ensemble. These awards will be presented by an adjudicator. All scholarship winners will be announced at the Closing Ceremonies. Please note that any adjudication packages not picked up will be sent to the school after the Festival by regular mail or courier as soon as possible.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF STANDARDS OF PERFORMANCE

The Standards of Performance will be inside the Director's Package and will not be announced or posted at the Festival. However, the national media and general public will receive the results any time after 8:00 pm the day of the performance.

REGISTRATION FORMS AND FEES

Registration forms are an integral part of the MusicFest experience. These forms enable the staff to ensure that the performance stage is ready, the sound technicians will get the sound just right, make sure that the ensemble is scheduled in the correct class and category for publication in the Official Program, the room supervisors can introduce the group correctly and the adjudicators will properly identify the ensemble and the selections to be performed. These forms should have been received by April 15, 1994. All incomplete forms must be completed at the Registration Desk which will result in possible delays in registration. Ensembles receive a state-

ment of account with the Confirmation of Performance. All registration payments were due by April 14, 1994. Registration fees must be paid in full and all forms completed before passes and concert tickets will be issued to any ensemble.





In most cases, one will go to a clarinetist, the other to a saxophonist. The cash awards will be presented following the Festival and must be used before December 31, 1994 by individuals

meeting the criteria as set out by the Board of Directors. The decision of the Festival will be final in all cases.
