





Music is Healing

Berklee College of Music is proud to announce an exciting new major in music therapy, to begin in the fall. Music therapists are able to improve people's lives by using music as a tool to bring about positive personal change. Music therapy is applied with exceptional children and adolescents as well as adults who have special needs. Berklee's music therapy program will bring a new vision to this fulfilling profession. The National Association of Music Therapy has tentatively approved the program, pending graduation of the first student in the major.

Berklee's approach to music therapy is like none other, and Berklee's curriculum prepares music therapists for diverse employment opportunities. Berklee's courses include a Core Music Curriculum, an emphasis in the Behavioral Sciences, and the specialized professional music therapy concentration. Music therapy courses integrate the latest in music and medical technology as they teach basic theory and foundations for the use of music as therapy.

Berklee students will train in the field. Many of Berklee's music therapy courses offer a concurrent practicum where students apply the skills that they are learning in the classroom. During this field work, students design, implement and evaluate a music therapy program in well-known hospitals, schools and clinical facilities in the Boston area. Students are guided through this process with individual supervision on-site and using video observation and feedback techniques back on campus.

Berklee has chosen a veteran music therapy practitioner and champion to head the program. Suzanne B. Hanser, Ed.D, former President of the National Association for Music Therapy, will serve as chair of the new major: "I think Berklee is the most exciting thing to happen to music therapy in a long time ... Berklee is an ideal place for a music therapy program, because of the focus on contemporary music and the technological resources the college has." PARTICIPANT'S REGISTRATION

It is imperative to register at the Registration Desk prior to taking in any activities at the Festival. Everyone will need to pick up their Festival Passes and/or tickets before the adjudicated performance or attending any workshops or concerts. If you need to purchase any additional passes you may do so at the Desk. The Registration Desk is located in Conference Room G, on the main floor of the Constellation Hotel, down the hall from the Hotel Registration Foyer. The office will be open on Tuesday, May 21 from 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm, Wednesday, May 22 to Saturday, May 25 from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm and on Sunday, May 26 from 7:00 am to 6:00 pm. Please allow yourself plenty of time to register prior to your performance time. There will be a \$5.00 replacement fee assessed for any lost participant passes with no exceptions. Each registered participant will receive a Participant Pass, Official Program and Festival Newspaper. Passes must be worn at all times while on the Festival Sites.

NON PARTICIPANT/ AUDITOR REGISTRATION

A limited number of non participant passes are available at the Registration Desk to non performers. Non participants may register for all activities for 5 days for \$35.00 or may purchase single day passes for \$18.00 per day.

ADJUDICATION PACKAGES

Standards of Performance plaques, the Gold, Silver and Bronze awards for each participating ensemble will be available for pick up, along with adjudication sheets and tapes, at the Registration Desk between 7:00 pm & 8:00 pm (subject to the adjudicator deliberation meetings) the day of the performance and during posted office hours the day following the performance. For those ensembles performing on Sunday, May 26, adjudication packages will be available for pick up between 6:30 pm and 7:30 pm Sunday evening. Honour Award Recipients will receive their Awards immediately following the adjudicated performance of their ensemble. These awards will be presented by an adjudicator. All scholarship winners will be announced at the Closing Ceremonies. Please note that any adjudication packages not picked up will be sent to the school after the Festival by regular mail or courier as soon as possible.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF STANDARDS OF PERFORMANCE

The Standards of Performance will be inside the Director's Package and will not be announced or posted at the Festival. However, the national media and general public will receive the results any time after 8:00 pm the day of the performance.

REGISTRATION FORMS AND FEES

Registration forms are an integral part of the MusicFest experience. These forms enable the staff to ensure that the performance stage is ready, the sound technicians will get the sound just right, make sure that the ensemble is scheduled in the correct class and category for publication in the Official Program, the room supervisors can introduce the group correctly and the adjudicators will properly identify the ensemble and the selections to be performed. These forms were due April 15, 1996. Ensembles received a statement of account with the Confirmation of Performance. All registration payments were due by April 15, 1996. Registration fees must be paid in full and all forms completed before passes and concert tickets will be issued to any ensemble.

INSTRUMENT REPAIR SHOP

The repair shop is sponsored by St. John's Music Ltd. and will be located in the Yamaha Display Area, Jupiter I Room at the Constellation Hotel. All minor repairs will be free of charge to MusicFest Canada participants.

This will take place in the Constellation Hotel, Venus and Neptune Rooms, Sunday, May 26 immediately following the closing ceremonies and will last until 12:00 midnight.

EVENING CONCERTS

All Concerts require advance ticketing. Tickets are issued in order based on the date of the fax request for tickets and the date the registration forms and fees were received by the national office.

Ensemble Directors may choose from the list of concerts for the 8:00 or 9:30 performances each evening up to a total of the number of participant/auditor passes that they have purchased. The ensemble may be split between show times and concert artists. Tickets must be picked up the day of the concert, in the registration office between 11:00 am and 6:00 pm.

The Whitby Brass Band traces its heritage back as far as 1857. The group in its present form started after World War II when several dedicated musicians in the Whitby area "recommissioned" the band instruments that had long ago been put into storage.

Over the past years, several names have applied to this band: Whitby Citizens Band, Whitby Police Band and finally, The Whitby Brass Band. A series of dedicated bandmasters have conducted and instructed the band over the years including Eric Clarke, Stanley Redfearn, Barry Hodgins, and the current conductor, Roland Hill.

The band is community based and all the band members are amateurs in the true sense of the word in that they play for the love of music itself. The band performs brass band material in the tradition of the world famous British Brass Bands. The compositions and arrangements are written for traditional instrumentation including cornets, Eb horns and percussion. The music demands the highest level of performance from the 32 all brass performers.

Roland Hill was born in Yorkshire, England, in the heart of British Brass Band



Country. He received his early musical training through the Salvation Army. In the late sixties and early seventies Roland was Principle Tuba in the Band of The Royal Air Force Regiment, where his tours of duty included Buckingham Palace (The Changing of the Guard Ceremony) and foreign tours of Cyprus, Germany and Hong Kong. In 1978 Roland emigrated to Canada and by 1980 became Bandmaster of the Whitby Brass Band.



\$150.00 each to outstanding performers participating in the National Festival.


LAURIER SAXOPHONE QUARTET






