## **Ensemble**

**GOLD AWARDS:** Gold plaques will be awarded to ensembles who, in the opinion of the adjudicators and the Festival, have achieved excellence in many facets of performance.

**SILVER AWARDS:** Silver plaques will be awarded to ensembles who, in the opinion of the adjudicators and the Festival, have achieved an exceedingly high standard of performance.

**BRONZE AWARDS:** Bronze plaques will be awarded to ensembles who, in the opinion of the adjudicators and the Festival, have achieved an above average standard of performance, with latitude for improvement.

## **Individual/Sectional**

**YAMAHA KANDO AWARD:** Yamaha Canada Music Limited will provide a product award of \$4,000.00 to an individual musician, who, in the opinion of the adjudicators, has demonstrated outstanding musicianship, past musical achievements and solo performances. The award will be presented following the Festival and must be used before December 31, 2003 by individuals meeting the criteria as set out by the Board of Directors. The decision of the Festival will be final in all cases.

**GALAXIE RISING STAR AWARDS:** Galaxie, CBC's Continuous Music Network, in conjunction with the Festival, will provide two (2) cash scholarships in the amount of \$2,000.00 to two most outstanding individual instrumental performers. The cash awards will be presented following the Festival and must be used before December 31, 2003 by individuals meeting the criteria as set out by the Board of Directors. The decision of the Festival will be final in all cases.

**MIAC SCHOLARSHIP:** The Music Industries Association of Canada, in conjunction with the Festival, will provide cash scholarships in the amount of \$1,000.00 to a most outstanding individual instrumental performer. The cash award will be presented following the Festival and must be used before December 31, 2003 by individuals meeting the criteria as set out by the Board of Directors. The decision of the Festival will be final in all cases.

**MUSICFEST CANADA CHORAL SCHOLARSHIP:** The Festival will provide a cash scholarship in the amount of \$500.00 to a most outstanding individual choral performer. The cash award will be presented following the Festival and must be used before December 31, 2003 by individuals meeting the criteria as set out by the Board of Directors. The decision of the Festival will be final in all cases.

**I. KEITH MANN OUTSTANDING BAND DIRECTOR AWARD:** The Festival will provide a cash scholarship in the amount of \$500.00 to a most outstanding concert band director. The cash award will be presented following the Festival and must be used before December 31, 2003 by individuals meeting the criteria as set out by the Board of Directors. The decision of the Festival will be final in all cases.

**HUMBER COLLEGE MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS:** Humber College, in conjunction with MusicFest Canada, will provide a minimum of six full tuition scholarships to outstanding performers participating in the National Festival.

**ZILDJIAN OUTSTANDING PERCUSSIONIST AWARD:** The Zildjian Company, in conjunction with MusicFest Canada, will provide a \$500.00 scholarship for college plus a set of Classic Orchestral Selection hand cymbals to an outstanding percussionist. The cash award will be presented following the Festival and must be used before December 31, 2003 by individuals meeting the criteria as set out by the Board of Directors. The decision of the Festival will be final in all cases.

**ZILDJIAN OUTSTANDING PERCUSSION SECTION AWARD:** The Zildjian Company, in conjunction with MusicFest Canada,

will provide a \$500.00 contribution to the Best Percussion Section plus a set of Classic Orchestral Selection hand cymbals to a most outstanding percussion section. The cash award will be presented following the Festival to the section meeting the criteria as set out by the Board of Directors. The decision of the Festival will be final in all cases.

**ZILDJIAN OUTSTANDING DRUMSET PLAYER AWARD:** The Zildjian Company, in conjunction with MusicFest Canada, will provide a \$500.00 scholarship for college or drumset camp plus a four-piece set of A Custom cymbals and a box of drumsticks to a most outstanding drummer. The cash award will be presented following the Festival and must be used before December 31, 2003 by individuals meeting the criteria as set out by the Board of Directors. The decision of the Festival will be final in all cases.

**ZILDJIAN OUTSTANDING COMBO DRUMMER AWARD:** The Zildjian Company, in conjunction with MusicFest Canada, will provide a four-piece set of A Custom cymbals and a box of drumsticks to a most outstanding combo drummer. The cymbals will be presented following the Festival to an individual meeting the criteria as set out by the Board of Directors. The decision of the Festival will be final in all cases.

**ZILDJIAN OUTSTANDING YOUNG DRUMMER AWARD:** The Zildjian Company, in conjunction with MusicFest Canada, will provide a four-piece set of A Custom cymbals and a box of drumsticks to a most outstanding young drummer. The cymbals will be presented following the Festival to an individual meeting the criteria as set out by the Board of Directors. The decision of the Festival will be final in all cases.

**NEW WEST JAZZ CLINICS SCHOLARSHIPS:** The New West Jazz Clinics, in conjunction with MusicFest Canada, will provide two tuition scholarships valued at \$150.00 each to outstanding performers participating in the National Festival. The Scholarships must be used at the 2003 New West Jazz Clinics.

**JAZZWORKS 2003 SCHOLARSHIPS:** Jazzworks 2003, in conjunction with MusicFest Canada, will provide two tuition scholarships valued at \$295.00 each plus accommodations and meals, to two outstanding performers participating in the National Festival. The Scholarships must be used at the 2003 Jazzworks workshop.

**HONOUR AWARDS:** MusicFest Canada may, at their discretion, select an individual from each ensemble performing at MusicFest to receive the MusicFest Honour Award. The award consists of a commemorative plaque.

## **Ensemble**

**MÉDAILLES D'OR:** Les Médailles d'Or seront remises aux ensembles qui, dans l'opinion des Evaluateurs du Festival, méritent l'excellence dans plusieurs secteurs de leur concert.

**MÉDAILLES D'ARGENT:** Les Médailles d'Argent seront remises aux ensembles qui, dans l'opinion des Evaluateurs du Festival, ont réalisé un niveau de forte qualité dans leur concert.

**MÉDAILLES DE BRONZE:** Les Médailles de Bronze seront remises aux ensembles qui, dans l'opinion des Evaluateurs du Festival, ont réalisé un niveau de moyenne qualité et éprouvé certaines difficultés.

## **Individuelles/Section**

**YAMAHA KANDO AWARD:** Yamaha Canada Music Limited va décerner une récompense d'une valeur de 4000\$ à la personne qui, de l'avis des examinateurs, possède un talent remarquable pour la musique appuyé par ses antécédents et ses prestations solo. La récompense sera remise à la fin du festival et devra être

déboursée avant le 31 décembre 2003 par la personne qui répond aux exigences du Conseil d'administration. La décision du Festival sera définitive dans tous les cas.

**RÉCOMPENSE DE GALAXIE POUR LES ÉTOILES DE DEMAIN:** Le réseau de musique continue Galaxie offre, de concert avec le Festival, deux (2) bourses d'études en argent comptant de 2000\$ aux deux meilleurs instrumentalistes individuels. Les sommes seront remises à la fin du Festival et devront être déboursées avant le 31 décembre 2003 par les personnes qui répondent aux exigences du Conseil d'administration. La décision du Festival sera définitive dans tous les cas.

**BOURSES D'ÉTUDES OFFERTES PAR L'ASSOCIATION DES INDUSTRIES EN MUSIQUE DU CANADA:** L'Association des Industries en Musique du Canada, en collaboration avec MusicFest, remettra Bourses d'Études au montant de \$1,000.00 au meilleur musicien dans son excellente présentation. Le montant de la Bourse sera remis après le Festival et devra être employé avant le 31 décembre 2003, à la suite de réunions du Bureau des Directeurs, se conformant aux critères exigés, et la décision sera finale pour toutes les présentations.

**BOURSE D'ÉTUDE DE MUSICFEST CANADA - CHANT CHORAL:** Le Festival offrira une bourse d'études de 500\$ en argent comptant à l'excellence dans le domaine du chant chorale. La récompense sera présentée à l'issue du Festival et doit être déboursée avant le 31 décembre 2003 par les personnes qui auront satisfait aux critères énoncés par le Conseil d'administration. La décision du Festival sera définitive, dans tous les cas.

True North's membership includes two outstanding composer/arrangers who create the ensemble's fresh and unique programming. Proudly Canadian in focus and expression, True North Brass has been welcomed not only in Canada but in China and throughout North America. The ensemble has released three critically acclaimed CD recordings on the Opening Day label. Its newest recording, *A True North Christmas*, was the most frequently played disc on Canadian classical radio stations throughout the 2001 holiday season. The group was also featured on CBC television's *Opening Night Christmas* music special.

True North Brass were featured guest artists at the International Brass Symposium in Atlanta, Georgia in March 2000, chosen from the elite of the international brass world. They accompanied Prime Minister Chretien's 1998 trade mission to China, performing recitals in Beijing and Wuhan and directing masterclasses at the Beijing Conservatory. Stuart Laughton was a founding member of The Canadian Brass at age 19 and principal trumpet at La Scala, Milan under Claudio Abbado when he was 23. A graduate of Philadelphia's Curtis Institute, he has recently appeared as concert soloist with both the Toronto and Winnipeg Symphony Orchestras and premiered R. Murray Schafer's trumpet concerto (*The Falcon's Trumpet*, 1996) which was dedicated to him. According to Classical Music Magazine - CD Review, "Laughton's renditions of the classic trumpet favourites are as fine as any in the current record catalogue."

Trumpeter Raymond Tizzard is Concertmaster and Artistic Director of The Hannaford Street Silver Band. Under his leadership the ensemble has become a major force on the Canadian scene. Raymond's love of brass music stems from his childhood experiences performing with The Whitby Brass Band. He is presently a member of The Canadian Opera Company and National Ballet orchestras and is in great demand as a performer, clinician and consultant.

Joan Watson's solo work as well as her lectures for musicians on goal-setting and orchestral audition psychology are much in demand. Her teachers include the celebrated virtuosi Hermann Baumann and Dale Clevenger. Previously principal horn with the Victoria Symphony and Canadian Opera Company Orchestra, Joan has been Associate Principal French Horn of the Toronto Symphony since 1987 and has just released her first solo album, "Songs My Mother Taught Me".

Alastair Kay is a consummate trombone soloist who currently leads the trombone section of Rob McConnell's Grammy Award-winning jazz ensemble The Boss Brass. He has worked with leading symphony orchestras as well as entertainers such as Frank Sinatra and Ella Fitzgerald. One of the busiest musicians on the planet, Al also finds time to chair the brass department at Toronto's Humber College.

Tubist Scott Irvine cannot be categorized. His arrangements and compositions are regularly featured by a variety of ensembles and have been documented on several CBC discs. Diplômé du *Philadelphia Curtis Institute*, il a récemment interprété le concerto pour trompette (*The Falcon's Trumpet* - 1996) de R. Murray Schafer en première mondiale avec les orchestres de Toronto et de Winnipeg. Le maître lui avait d'ailleurs dédié ce concerto. 

The Nathaniel Dett Chorale is the first professional chamber choir in Canada dedicated to performing a full range of Afrocentric choral music: African, North American, Afro-Brazilian, West Indian and more. Back in 1920, Nathaniel Dett, a black composer born in Niagara Falls and educated in the United States, wrote a treatise entitled "The Emancipation of Negro Music". Fifty-eight years after Dett's death, the choir named in his honour is taking the same emancipating spirit (as well as Dett's compositions) into the concert halls of Canada. They have performed at the Skydome for South African President Nelson Mandela, CBC's "Live On Stage" Series, Christmas at Convocation Hall where they presented "An Indigo Christmas", and most recently were featured on CBC. This year they will perform two concerts at MusicFest Canada.

Brainerd Blyden-Taylor is currently in his 11th season as Artistic Director of the Nathaniel Dett Chorale. From 1987 to 2002 he was Artistic Director of the Orpheus Choir of Toronto and the Orpheus Chamber Choir. He served as the Co-Chair of the Music Committee of the Board of the Toronto Arts Council. Brainerd has served as Music Director for a variety of events including the Martin Luther King Jr. Tribute, the Great Cleveland Choral Invitational, O Canada Project, the International Gospel Festival, Black History Jambalaya and Still We Sing, G7 Summit Arts Presentation, Whitby Summer Institute of Church Music, Ontario Choral Federation Youth Sing, New Brunswick Choral Federation Youth Sing, and the Georgian Bay Children's Choir Afrocentric Festival. He has also worked with the Oakville Symphony, North York Symphony and the Peterborough Singers. Brainerd presently serves on the faculty of Queen's University as Director of the Chorale Ensemble.
